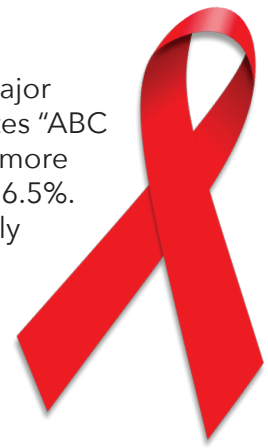


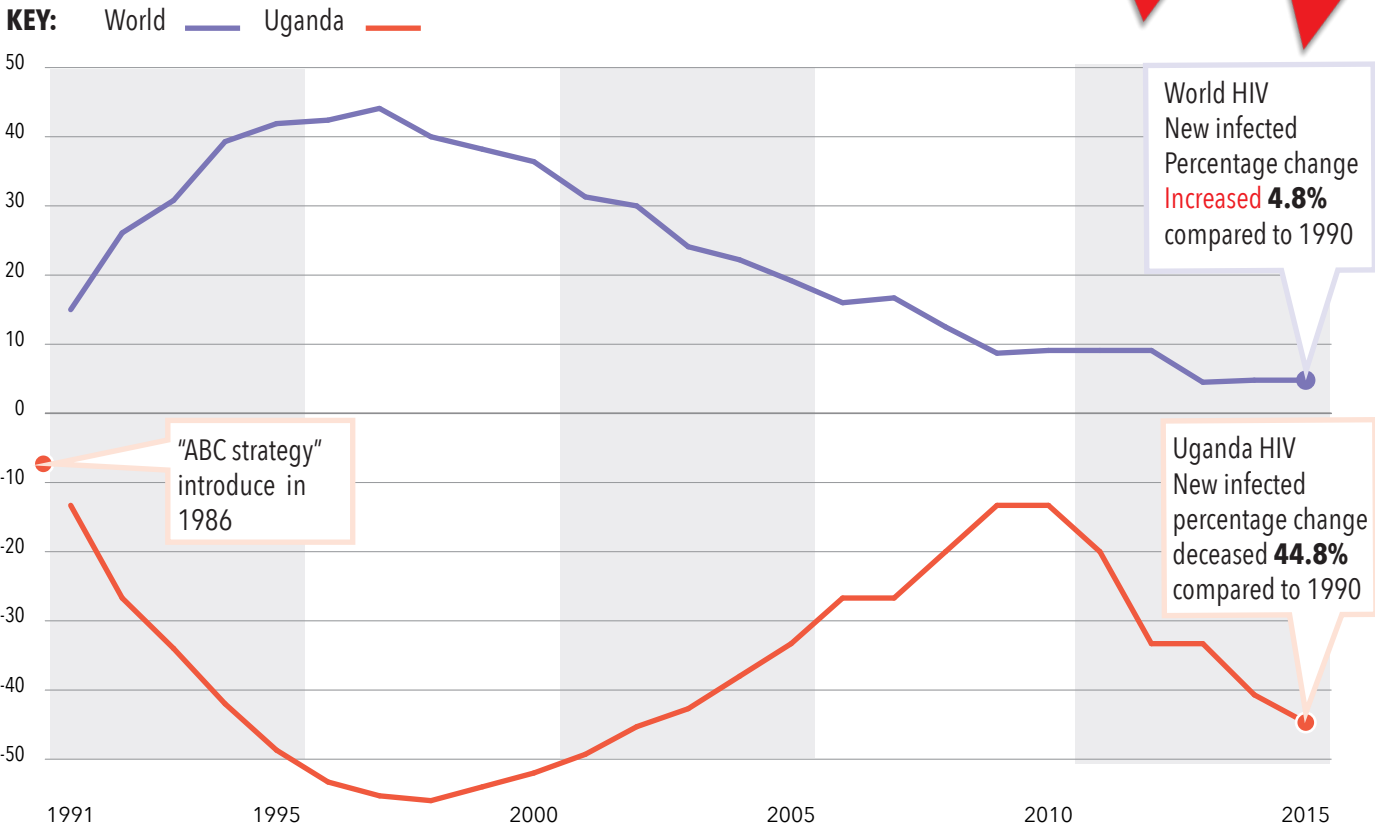
Uganda Change Your preset of HIV

Uganda, a country in East Africa, successfully controls the spread of HIV/AIDS, a major health issue in Uganda from 1980 - 2015. After President Yoweri Museveni promotes "ABC strategy" in 1986, HIV/AIDS infection rates reduce significantly. Back in the 1980s, more than 30% of Uganda population are HIV-positive. Now the adult HIV prevalence is 6.5%. The reduction of multi-sexual partner and the spread of condom usage successfully control HIV newly infection.



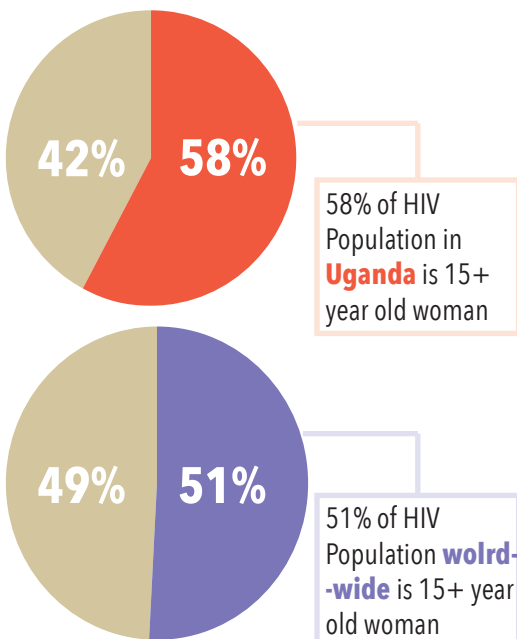
Uganda HIV newly infected deceased yearly

Uganda have been continually increased effect to HIV treatment. In 2015, 57% of the HIV-positive population in Uganda have access to Antiretroviral therapy, a medicine suppressing the HIV virus and stop the progression of AIDS. However, the world coverage of Antiretroviral is 42%.
