New York City Cinemas of Past and Present

Historically, New York has been considered the cultural mecca of the United States. It's a melting pot of cultures, allowing its diversity to bleed into all aspects of the city. Along with being a cultural hub, New York is also renowned for being an artistic capital – from Broadway to the hundreds of art galleries to the street performers. While many movies have showcased New York as a backdrop, the history of movie theaters in the city is just as rich. There are five historic independent theaters still functioning and standing in the same spot in which they opened. Those theaters are The Paris Theater, Theatre 80 St. Marks, The Waverly Theater (renamed to The IFC Center in 2005), Anthology Film Archives, and the Angelika Film Center. Although gentrification has caused the downfall of quite a few historic theater houses, but the appreciation for independent and 35mm films is being continued on through a few new "old" theaters like Sunshine Cinema and Metrograph.
